Mrs. Rita A. Danese of 92 Shand Ave., Warwick, has her neighborhood in stitches.

Since Christmas she has been teaching 15 girls, ranging in ages from seven to 12 years old, how to knit.

In December, Mrs. Danese knitted 283 outfits for dolls for Christmas presents.

"During the holidays, when the neighborhood little girls saw them, they kept asking me to teach them to knit,' she said.

"It sounded like a fun idea to me and the first week I had a class, eight girls showed up. The second week there were 12 and the third week 15.

"They were a little too much to handle at one time, so I split the class up in three groups. Five met on Monday afternoons, five on Tuesdays and five on Wednesdays.

"Thursdays, I helped the ones, who were having difficulties," she explained.

The knitting classes have been a voluntary donation of her time and Mrs. Danese's pupils have been appreciative. "My little girls are wonderful," she said.

"When I told them that I had taken an evening job,

they told me not to worry. They offered to do my housework for me."

"After a while I saw little girls I never saw before coming to look at me through my windows," she said.
