## World's Biggest Quilt?

A Warwick woman is working on what she hopes will be the biggest quilt in the world.

Mrs. Rita Damese of 92 Shand Ave. is one-third finished. By Feb. 15 she hopes to have completed a 48,000-piece quilt which she will enter in the Brockton, Mass., fair in July and the Eastern States Exposition in September.

The official record is 28,000 pieces. Mrs. Damese said, however, a woman in Poplar Bluff, Mo., claims to have made one with 38,000 pieces.

Initially, the work is done on an electric sewing machine. "Then you put a backing on

it, lay it on a frame and quilt
it by hand," she says.
A quilter for six years, she
spends about eight hours a day

on it.

"I want to bring the championship to Rhode Island," she said. "No one has gotten a blue ribbon in 94 years."

For any Pawtuxet Valley women with a lot of time and patience, "I'd love to have some local competition," she adds.
